WORKSHOP: Designing a Landscape Quilt

Space is limited. Sign up soon! October 19 and November 2, 2019 FEE: \$95 payable to the Guild \$6 material fee payable to instructor

Description: Create a small quilted seascape while learning fabric selection and Carol's special pieced appliqué construction method. This class will start with discussions on how Carol creates patterns. Then while using either one of her designs (four to pick from) or drafting your own design begin fabric selection with tips for creating visual depth in your water, sky and islands. During this step, pieced appliqué construction technique will be demonstrated, using both the hand and machine methods. Then taking this seascape, we will give it an authentic look while exploring the basic surface embellishment techniques I use in my landscape quilts. Learn the processes for creating textured objects, such as bushes and trees from far away to up close and personal. Create water movement and shading as well as a passing sail boat using thread painting and machine embroidery.

March Block of the Month

Such beautiful Valentine's blocks! Thanks to everyone who participated in both meetings! Anne Roncin won the afternoon 25 blocks so I'm sure she and Dana will be busy putting those together. Greta Simmons won the 15 blocks in the evening. We were lucky as Sharon Horncastle brought in two quilts from her previous wins. So fun to see the BOM in a finished quilt.

For March we've chosen a strawberry block which is 7 1/2" x 10 1/2" unfinished, and uses scraps. The pinks (or reds) can be cut from any number of different fabrics. For the calyx (green bit) I used three different green fabrics (A, B, and C) to create the definition of the different leaves and stem. Cutting:

This block uses half square triangles. I've increased the size to $3^{"}$. Once sewn together (draw a diagonal line then sew $\frac{1}{4}$ " on either side, cut to get 2 half square triangles), trim HST to 2 inches.

Don't worry about trimming it or adding the borders like in the picture on the web site. The colours are white or cream for the background (tone on tone works fine), green for the leaves (there's 2 different fabrics for the leaves and another one for the stem) and for the strawberry go for reds / pinks.


Log Cabin Block (10 1/2" unfinished)


Fabric Requirements:

- 2 1/2" wide strips of various darks (reds)
- 2 1/2" wide strips of lights (white cream)
- 2 1/2" squares of yellow for centres

8 rows of 6 blocks will give you a quilt approximately 60" x 80".

No borders needed, just layer, quilt and bind.
