Donation Quilts

Our 'Backing Bonanza' at the April meeting was a great success! Thanks to everyone who took fabric for their donation quilts and/or who purchased fabric for their own use. We raised enough money to purchase more batting before September. And, there is now more space in our storage unit!

We will be delivering donation quilts at the end of May to our community groups.

At our April meeting, we received 12 lap quilts, 3 NICU quilts, 4 child/baby quilts, and 5 wheelchair quilts, for a total of 24. We also received 7 knitted premie hats for the NICU, and 4 totes for Crossroads.

The Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU) is running very low on incubator quilts. In 2023, 264 newborns spent at least one night in the NICU. They all received a handmade quilt during their stay and then took it home. Requirements: 36" x 48" (or close), which allows for the overhang. Batting is not necessary, nor is intricate stitching. Dark flannelette backing is preferred to block out the light.
