2020/2021 Workshops

Looking ahead optimistically here is the workshop lineup for the coming year. (registration form on page 9) We will not hold a workshop unless it is deemed safe to gather. Our meeting space is large enough to exercise social distancing. We may have to limit numbers if restrictions are in place. To ensure your space, sign up early. September 26 2020 Playing with Rulers Fee \$50.

Silly Moon Quilt Company will help you learn the magic of quilting with rulers. They provide the rulers and you get to play while they offer support, guidance and demonstrations. You will receive a \$10. credit from your registration fee toward rulers purchased on the day of the class. You must have a ruler foot that fits your machine.

October 17&18,2020 Pet Portraits Anne Mather Fee: \$120 CLASS IS LIMITED TO 12 STUDENTS. In this 2 day workshop you will learn how to make a pattern from a photo and use it to make an adorable portrait of your favourite pet. You will work from your own black and white image to make a "paint by number" master pattern and then you'll learn how to create the portrait using a raw edge fusible appliqué method. If you are comfortable using small pieces of fabric you will love this technique and be amazed at the results.

Students must bring an enlarged colour photo and a mirror

image black and white version to the workshop. Photos must be identical in size. Instructions for preparing your photo will be included in the supply list.

On the second day, Anne will demonstrate how to make a background to showcase your portrait and how to free motion



quilt the portrait and other finishing details so you will be able to complete the assembly and quilting after the class.

Nov.14, 2020 Quilting Inspired by Nature Dara Tomasson

Fee: \$40.00 In this interactive and hands on workshop, participants will learn 10 new quilting designs. As we study the elements, students translate the beauty of nature into



free motion excellence through design challenges; exploring the art of combining designs to make them their own. Some free motion guilting experience necessary.

November 28, 2020 UFO Fee: \$10.00

Tackle all those unfinished projects in time for Christmas and surrounded by the pleasure of quilting with friends.

February 20, 2021 Celtic Piecing Kylah Shay Fee: \$40

Learn about the technique of Celtic piecing, not appliqué, and experiment with a variety of ways to create your design. Project will not be exactly as illustrated.



March 27, 2021 More than a Straight

Edge Ionne McCauley Fee: \$50.00 This popular workshop is back. Ionne will lead you in this practical workshop covering a wide variety of ways to finish the edges of your quilts. We will be making "workbook" samples that you can refer to later. Learn how to make bindings for curved, scalloped and oddball edges, how to join binding ends and how to make hanging sleeves. Lots of tips!





May 15 & 29, 2021 Picture to Wall Hanging Kathy Bush

Fee: \$90.00 This class demonstrates a technique of taking a photograph or painting of your choice and creating a oneof-a-kind machine appliquéd, quilted wall-hanging. The process involves using the picture or painting (participants are responsible for obtaining copyright permission from original artist) to create a pattern, enlarge it to a desired size, mark it for construction purposes, and use paper backed fusible and fabrics of your choice to complete your design. This class is for the experienced quilter with an expectation that you already know how to use fusible web and how to finish and enhance a machine appliquéd project once it is fused to the

background. It is basically a design and construction class that will require completion afterwards at home. Sewing machines will likely not be required.

Photographs or painting choices are to be approved by the instructor prior to the class to ensure suitability.

From CQA: Quilt Canada in Edmonton has been cancelled. We look forward to presenting a wonderful conference and celebration next year at Quilt Canada 2021, which is CQA/ACC's fortieth anniversary year. We hope you can join us for the party in Toronto June 15-19, 2021.

The NanGo Grannies have also cancelled their annual fabric sale, usually held at the end of September each year.

Challenge

The 2020 QUILT Challenge will begin in the fall. Your entries will be collected at our first return meeting, and each monthly meeting until November. At the December Christmas Party the Challenge entries will be hung for voting. With this pandemic these dates could changed.

The theme this year is **Modern Geometric** - Google 'modern geometric art' for ideas. Here are the Rules to Play by:

• No kit is required.

• Multiple entries are allowed; but only one ribbon per participant!

• Finished perimeter to be less than 100". For example: a circle less than $31\frac{1}{2}$ " or a square less than 25" x 25" or a rectangle less than 20" x 30".

• Colour palette must be limited to two of the three primary colours (Red, Blue or Yellow) and one of the three secondary colours (Green, Orange or Purple only).

• Background must be black or white - No grey or cream!

• Must have at least one circle, one square and one triangle of recognizable size.

• Use primary colours on the geometric shapes. (And anywhere else you like.)

• Submit in an opaque bag with your name pinned to the back
