Donation Quilts

This has been an enjoyable year for the Scrappy Bags as we have come to learn "the ropes" of performing the duties of the committee. We acknowledge the tremendous amount of work and dedication done by our predecessors, Pat Clements and Bonnie Dormuth; we thank them for their assistance in the transition.

In November of 2021, we distributed 60 quilts to nine community agencies. In the spring we donated another 24 quilts to the newly opened facility for women run by Samaritan House. In a few weeks, we will be donating more of your beautiful donation quilts to our agencies.

In addition to our quilt donations, we coordinated a knitted baby hat program for the Nanaimo Regional General Hospital. To date we have given 293 baby hats to the hospital, all gratefully received. We also responded to a request for baby book bags for the "Roots to Read" program, and have given 103 bags.

This year, we purchased a stamp for our labels, which has the NQG logo. This will greatly reduce the frustration and cost of ordering labels from the USA.

Our expenses for the year were below usual due to the nature of the Guild year. Now that we have had a year of learning, we are looking forward to a fruitful and enjoyable year ahead in distributing quilts to our community.

Quilt Show Report

Currently the committee needs 3 more Leads, for Demo's, Raffles, and Kitchen/Tea Room.

Certainly the Raffles are an important means of earning money to keep the Guild functioning. So far we have one quilt finished, and one to start, both at no cost to us. Sarah Beyer has gracelessly volunteered to quilt one or two more for the show. Thanks to all who are helping to get this important area going. Manual available.

Demo's is not too taxing, (although I haven't done it). You need to recruit members to do demonstrations with in a 30 minute time frame. Bonnie and I have some very promising leads so far and two confirmed for both days. Each day requires about 5 demo's.

During the show you are required to keep this area running on time and smoothly. Again there is a manual for this.

What can we say about the Kitchen/Tea room etc.? This is a big job that requires much organization and help. Can be a large area of revenue for the guild. How this will look is going to be discussed at the show meeting. If any one has suggestions please email them to me at anytime. This is everyone's show to participate in.

Bonnie and I will be going for our initial contact with Black and White frames next week.

Next show meeting will be Wednesday September 28.

Placemats

We have had a very good year. We started off the 2021/2022 guild year with 161 placemats and 51 tea cozies in September 2021. Over the year your contributions were a further 160 placemats and 57 tea cozies.

In December we donated 60 placemats to Meals on Wheels Nanaimo, 8 placemats to M-on-W in Ladysmith, 15 placemats and 5 tea cozies to M-on-W on Gabriola Island, and 100 placemats and 50 tea cozies to the Salvation Army for their Christmas Hamper Program.

We now have a balance of 138 placemats and 53 tea cozies. I am asking that you please turn those scraps into placemats over the coming months so we can be as generous next Christmas. If we have a tea room at the Quilt Show in June 2023 we will need to make sure we have about 80 placemats for that event. I want to thank you all for your donations to the Placemat Committee over the year. They are all so beautiful. Our Guild 2022 Challenge ~ Houses

Choose to do a small quilt that speaks to you of your idea of house and home. The quilts will be displayed for voting at the 2022 Christmas meeting. Rules to Play by:

- A quilt must have 3 layers: top, batting and backing.
- No kit or registration is required.

• Please don't use a commercial pattern. We want to see your ideas!

• You could choose to represent one room or a whole house. Let your imagination run free!

• Embellish as much as you want. Maybe you'll want to choose a holiday theme.

• Finished perimeter to be less than 100". E.g.: a circle smaller than $31\frac{1}{2}$ " in diameter, a square smaller than 25" x 25" or a rectangle less than 20" x 30" all qualify.

Colour palette and fabrics of your choosing.

• Submit quilt in an opaque bag with your name pinned to the back of the quilt and written on the bag. Please include your telephone number.

• Challenge quilt is due by the November meeting. This will allow us time to plan the hanging. An extension may be granted for reasonable grounds.

• There will be no prizes again this year, only ribbons.
