



The CQA website <u>canadianquilter.com</u> now has the information about the quilt show next year May 31 to June 2, 2018, being held in Vancouver. Call to entry information and dates are on line. 

CQA: Janet Knecht introduced Cindy Scraba who is sponsoring The Postcard Challenge at the CQA Show with very generous prizes. The theme is "Inspired by Nature". She also introduced Karen Killins-Robinson who will receive the postcards. Karen thanked the guild for their donations to the big Quilt Bee held at the CQA Show in Toronto this year. There were 2,641 quilts made, far exceeding the goal of 1,000 quilts. Karen also encouraged members to get their children and grandchildren involved in the Youth Challenge, "Going On a Journey". Island Sewing's Peter LeTourneux: Antique Sewing Machine Restoration Specialist

Peter LeTourneux, co-owner of Island Sewing Centre in Campbell River, became a sewing machine technician after a lifetime of service in the Canadian Armed Forces. His wife Christa's sewing machine needed repair so, like any good husband, he offered to fix it for her. A self-described tinkerer, Peter fixed Christa's machine and soon had several machines to repair once word spread through the sewing community.

Sensing a second career on the horizon, Peter invested time to train as a sewing machine technician with Brother Montreal, Husqvarna Viking, Pfaff Tennessee, as well as completing several industrial sewing machine courses. Before long, Island Sewing was moved out of the home and into retail space with Peter running the maintenance and repair side of the



business, with Christa and daughter Danielle running the store.

Peter's passion is the restoration of antique sewing machines, because "somebody's hand has been" involved in the manufacture of these older machines, unlike today's modern manufacturing processes. Materials like cast iron, sterling

silver, steel and gold make these older machines something special. Bringing antique sewing machines back to life at Island Sewing is a rewarding second career for Peter.

Restoration of an antique machine depends on where the machine was sold, and whether new/old stock parts are still available. If the machine was originally sold in North America, chances are good that parts can still be found, although Peter has creative ways of sourcing parts from all over the world. Is the machine complete? Does it run? What's the goal of the restoration – a running machine or a beautiful piece of furniture? These are some of the questions Peter answers with the client before a restoration is started.

Restorations can take a few days to several months, but for those of us with older or antique machines, Peter says, "Don't judge a book by its cover!" Often these machines just need a little TLC to bring them back to working order and beauty. Time to dust off our antiques.


