#### October 20: Sliced Circles with Ionne McCauley

Circles are among the most satisfying shapes to work with and the combination of circles and straight lines is exciting.

#### **November 17: Free Motion Quilting with Vicki Dods**

Only a few spaces left in both the morning and afternoon classes.

Morning: Enjoy a half-day session of free motion quilting. Become familiar with several all over designs as well as repetitive patterns useful for borders and sashings. The session is aimed at beginning level free motion quilters.

Afternoon: Feather play is the theme of the afternoon session. Learn various methods to create feather motifs. Then explore all over designs, shape fillers, border patterns and feathers with graceful, curving spines. This session would suit those who have some experience with free motion work. Members are welcome to attend one or both of the workshops.

Spend four hours of the day learning needle felting techniques with Nancy. Your finished project will be an 8 inch bunny rabbit.

The remainder of the day is devoted to playing with felting. Materials will be provided and you can use your creativity to create another critter or to try your hand at a scene.

#### March 23, 2019 Surprise Step by Step: Guess Who's Coming to Dinner?

Complete a mystery quilt in one class!



The project will be a table runner and coaches will be available to offer assistance. This promises to be a fun day. Four fabrics are required and you will receive pre cutting instructions prior to class.

#### **OTHER EVENTS**

All Year Long: Mystery Quilt: Your registration fee includes the pattern and at each Guild meeting you will receive the next step in creating *Mystery on the 'Oriental' Express*. The final product is a lap quilt or wall hanging measuring 55.5" square before borders. Three fabrics are required: a light (2 yards), medium (1 yard) and dark or bright (1 ¾ yards), plus binding (3/4- 1 yard) and binding (2 yards). Sorry about "yards" but it is a US pattern. If you wish to make a larger quilt (55.5" x 82") purchase 1.5 times the fabric required and make 1.5 times the blocks. Borders and binding may be purchased after the mystery has been solved but more of the same fabrics may not be available at that time.

Mini UFOs: Set aside December 1 or April 13 for completing projects or starting something new. Whatever you choose to do enjoy quilting with friends and bring something to share for a pot luck lunch.

**Garage Sale:** February 13. Rent a table with a friend and move along your no longer needed quilting supplies. Number of tables will be limited. Whether you are a seller or a shopper this will be a fun day.

# 2019 Call to Entry Categories: Some Category Definitions

#### **Modern Quilts**

"Modern quilts are primarily functional and inspired by modern design. Several characteristics often appear which may help identify a modern quilt. These may include the use of bold colours and prints, high contrast and graphic areas of solid colour, improvisational piecing, minimalism, expansive negative space, and alternate grid work. Modern traditionalism, i.e. the updating of classic quilt designs, is also often seen in Modern Quilting." At our 2016 Show, modern quilts were voted on in the Secret Categories as a trial. Sufficient were entered that now it is one of our major categories.

#### What Is a Group Quilt?

A Group Quilt is any work made by more than one person. It could be a Round Robin where several persons have made the quilt top. It may be quilted by someone else, including a professional long-armer who, incidentally, must be acknowledged on your Call To Entry. Having assistance in basting the quilt does not make it a group quilt as these stitches are removed. A joint endeavour can be a lot of fun.

#### What Is an Art Quilt?

Art Quilts may also be called Original Work. In it's pure form these are your own design, not derived or adapted from any existing work in any medium. It can be any size, shape or style: abstract, pictorial or originally interpreted traditional (using blocks and/or patterns in the public domain). You may create your own fabric

and include any form of surface design such as painting or print making, plus use of mixed media.

#### **Applique Quilts**

On a hand or machine appliqued quilt, more than 50% of the blocks must contain applique. Check off the appropriate box on your Call To Entry Form.

- 1. You must be a member in good standing of the Nanaimo Quilters' Guild as of **September 30**, **2018**
- 2. Call to Entry forms are due no later than March 20, 2019. In order to enter, you must complete both pages of the "Call to Entry" form, including your "story" (maximum 75 words) on the back of the first page. As well, you must complete the second page with a coloured photo or sketch of your entry. The forms will be collected at the Show table at each regular meeting from October 2018 to March 2019. Early entry is encouraged. Quilt need not be finished before form is submitted.
- 3. **Finished quilts** are due to be delivered to the Depot Captains no later than May 30. Your Depot Captain will contact you approximately 2 weeks prior to the Quilt Show to arrange a drop-off time for your project.
- 4. Use one entry form for **each** item. Please PRIORITIZE your projects using the designated line on both pages because we may not be able to display all projects.
- 5. Each submission must have an **identifying label attached to the back** of the project with quilt name, your name and phone number.
- 6. All quilts **must** have a 3" wide hanging sleeve attached across the width of the top of the quilt.
- 7. No project may be submitted that has been shown in a previous Nanaimo Quilt Show.
- 8. This year we will repeat the category, **First Show Entry**, for those who have never entered a quilt in a Nanaimo Quilt Show. Each eligible entrant will receive a participation ribbon. A prize will be awarded to the winner who will be selected by a random draw.
- 9. Your project **mus**t adhere to the size you indicate on the form. The Hanging Committee will organize the layout of the Quilt Show based on the information you submit. If you find the size of the finished item will be larger or smaller than stated on the form, please inform the call to entry committee.
- 10. Insurance The Nanaimo Quilt Guild cannot be held responsible for loss or damage to your entry. Please ensure your entry is covered by your homeowner's insurance.
- 11. Pick up will be 2:30 3:30 Sunday June 9, 2019. No provision will be made for early pick-up. Only the Takedown Committee will be allowed on the show floor after 12:30 on Sunday, June 9th. In order to claim your items you **must** present the receipt you receive from your Depot Captain. If you are unable to pick up your items yourself, please inform your depot captain of the name and phone number of your delegate. Make sure your delegate has all ofyour receipts.
