Donation Quilts



The guild supplies the backing and batting in this size only. You can make larger quilts if you want. Members also make quilts year round for this charity and can be handed in year round.

Note: Dimensions noted are for finished size, unless otherwise stated. If making your own, then add 1/4" around each B and C block








Outer rectangle measures 3 1/2" x 6 1/2"
