October Quilt Along

We completed our first month of Farm Girl 2. I knew three people at retreat had made blocks. BJ brought her blocks to the evening meeting. Thank you so much! In future you must bring your blocks, get checked off and hand them to be eligible for the draw, which will be made at the evening meeting. I will ensure you receive your prize. October's winner was **Kathleen Kane**.

Thanks to Sarah Beyer for helping out on the evening meeting. We will still accept sign ups to join the fun. Just start from where we are.

Some hints to make Columns 2 easier: when using a square to make a triangle corner on a rectangle, start sewing from the long side rather than the corner. It's less likely to get chewed up in the needle plate. Sew a thread or two to the direction you'll be folding your triangle so you get a better fit. If it's too big you'll resolve that when you square up your unit

Lay your block out on a piece of fabric or batting so you can see immediately if you've missed cutting any pieces. This also makes it easier to see your next steps.

Fidget Quilts for Seniors

Here are the parameters for the fidget blankets that VIHA (Vancouver Island Health Authority) has requested for their senior folks in emergency that may be experiencing levels of dementia.

They should be no smaller than a 20 inch square and no bigger than a 24 inch square. I used 6 inch squares: 4 across, 4 down - which gave a 22 inch square. No batting is needed. Use fleece or a really good, heavier flannel for the backing (JYSK often has fleece blankets for \$5 or less). The strap should be attached on one side near the top. Finished length should be 36 inches long with a small square of Velcro attached at either end. Please see the picture.

A variety of items can be used as long as there are no sharp edges and they are securely fastened. Some items to use are: lace, big buttons, zippers (as long as the pull is large), ribbon, tassels, other fancy trim, fabric with different textures (flannel, satin, corduroy, etc.), large beads, old ties, etc. Dollar and thrift stores will give you more ideas.

Be careful with black and white fabrics as this can be difficult for some to see. Wild patterns can also be disorientating. Bright colours are great. Try to have some of the fabric squares relate to familiar things such as animals, pets, food, flowers, other scenery, common activities, etc. The familiar is comforting!

Please leave the blankets at the Donations table and I will collect them. Thank you for your help! Nancy Lutes


