Minutes of General Meeting June 20, 2007

Haven House provides a safe shelter for women and their children when they need to escape from violent and abusive situations at home. This quilt is a gift to the family. Our guild, being a non profit, community service organization, has been providing many of these 'comfort quilts' for many years.

The sign up sheets will be out at the September Guild Meeting. We have room for 20 teams, with a maximum of 3 people on each team. Each team supplies the fabric for their quilt top. The Guild supplies the batting and backing for each quilt. We will have patterns available at the sign up but you are welcome to choose your own pattern.

From our Quilt Bee in January of this year we gave 55 quilts to Haven House!! (this included 10 quilts completed from the Christmas Party Bingo squares).

We will have a POTLUCK lunch that day. Please bring your favourite dish to share.

Thanks from Material Magic Raffle Committee

Many thanks to all guild members for supporting us selling raffle tickets. We sold 5622 tickets (281 books) bringing in \$11,244.00. After expenses, we gave \$5,446.54 to the Nanaimo Comfort Quilt Society. From the Guild membership of 248, 45% of you sold tickets, 72% of members worked toward the show and 74% of members either sold tickets and/or worked at/for the show.

Seventy-four percent of our membership shared the workload of producing such an event. That is an amazing amount of donated time and effort. I know we would not have such a fabulous show without your support. Thank you, thank you, and thanks again. WOW, it was worth it to see the results at Beban Park.

NQG Block of the Month - September & October 2007

This year we decided to go back to the 12" block and use scrappy fabric whenever possible. Also we thought it would be better not to sign your block so that if you win the blocks, you could make up a quilt to give away if you do not choose to keep it for yourself.

For each of the months of September and October, we will be making a mosaic block; cut with the exact number of squares but laid out in a different design and colour. Try laying them out in other designs, it is very interesting to see how many designs you can come up with, with only half squares.

SEPTEMBER MOSAIC BLOCK

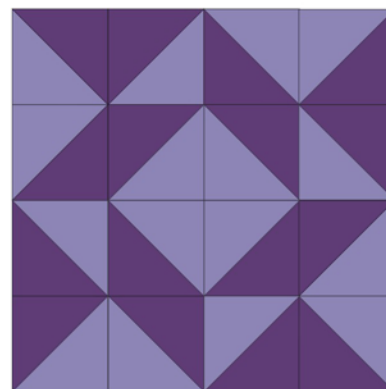
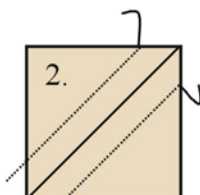
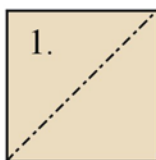
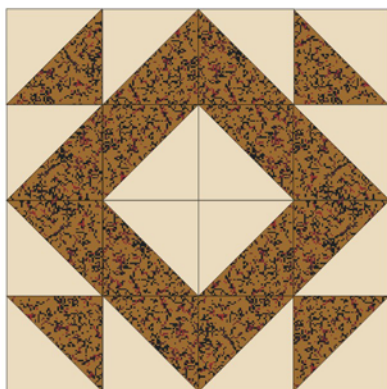
OCTOBER MOSAIC BLOCK

Colours:

Shaded area - any medium colour scrappy print fabric
Light area - light beige or beige on beige fabric

Colours:

Shaded area - any medium purple print fabric
Light area - light purple fabric



* For each month, cut eight 4" squares in each colour as suggested above for each block.

* Lay out one of each of the two colours, right sides together and mark the top from corner to corner, so you have eight ready to sew 1/4" from each side of the mark for each block.

* After sewing, cut on the mark, open and press for each and you will have 16 half-squares. Square each one to a 3 1/2" square using the 45 degree angle along your sewing line.

* Then you just lay them out into the pattern shown above to make your block. Sew the squares into rows and then sew the rows together to complete the block.

* Don't forget to square off the block to 12 1/2"
