We hope that having samples of the Instructors work on display at the Guild meetings will encourage and inspire you to sign on. Feedback has been positive about this (continued on page 2)





A Journaling project called "Creative Quilting, The Journal Quilt Project" was started five years ago by Karey Patterson Bresenhan and is coming to a close this year. Nearly a thousand quilters participated and they created nearly 6000 pages. Now it is our turn. We have seen the talent and the creativity we have in our area and in our Guild.

After the excitement and exhaustion of the Material Madness Quilt Show we could all use a small project that allows us to play. With the many new ideas, maybe too many, that we saw at the show, discovered through courses or just browsing through quilt shops and magazines you can now have these ideas take flight and use them for the Challenge. Rules are as follows for Novice or Experienced.

- Dimensions are 8 ½" wide X 11" long- or the size of a regular piece of paper. Please use it in this manner as we hope to put all the entries into the form of a Journal. Use any base you wish to create your page, eg: Timtex, paper, fabric, Lutradur, Tyvec, dryer lint, just to name a few.
- Use one "NEW TO YOU" technique: possibly one that you read about or saw in a class. For example: foiling, beading, free motion stitching, photo transfer, burning tools, stenciling, fabric painting, or EQ programs creations.
- Follow a theme—or Not!
- Use what you have. Try using a piece of fabric or an embellishment that has been sitting in your stash just waiting its turn. It's time!
- Incorporate one thing BLACK into your piece. It doesn't matter the size (a black bead, fabric, pigma pen letter or a drawing etc.) to ground your work.
- Place a letter, word or sentiment any size, any place, any how on the front of your creation. Please don't use your name: a first or last initial would be all right.
- Use as many layers as you wish—batting is not required, however the piece must be held together by some stitching. Finish the edges or keep it raw and natural: your choice.
- You can make more than one entry. They are to be turned in at the April Guild Meeting (or the Snowbirds can make arrangements with me) The entries will be displayed at the May meeting.

Meeting called to order at 1 p.m.

<u>Ongoing Business</u>: The issue of quilt donations will be on the agenda for the November guild meeting. We need as much input as possible. Please think about this and let the executive have your ideas. Irene Wright, honorary life member, recently passed away. Our Christmas donation of gift bags to Five Acres School should be brought to the November 21 meeting. (see page 4)

<u>Gabriola Quilt Raffle</u>: Karen Hatton and Sue Vohanka displayed a beautiful quilt made by the Gabriola Quilters, a raffle prize to raise money for the Gabriola Health Society to fund a Gabriola medical clinic.

### NQG Block of the Month - December 2007

This month three of the blocks can be used to make a nice Christmas table runner as shown on the directions below. Therefore for every three blocks that are turned in, one name will be picked to receive these blocks, so we should have more than one winner.

1. Cut: 1 Christmas print square 41/2"x 41/2" for A

4 red squares  $2\frac{1}{2}$ "x  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " and draw a line from corner to corner on the wrong side of each square for B (Do not cut)

<u>To piece</u> the center  $4\frac{1}{2}$ "x  $4\frac{1}{2}$ " block, place a B square right sides together on one corner of A and stitch on the drawn line, trim seam  $\frac{1}{4}$ ", press B open. Repeat with a B square on each of theremaining corners of A.

2. <u>Cut</u>: 2 squares of red 5"x 5"; cut each square in half on one diagonal tomake four C triangles

1 square 5 ½"x 5 ½" each of the white on white print and of the green; cut each square on both diagonals to make 4 white & 4 green D triangles <u>Using a precise ¼" seam</u>, sew each green D to a white D to make 4 D triangles and press towards the darker fabric. Sew each C to a D triangle, press toward C

3. <u>Cut</u>: 4 squares 4<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>"x 4<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" of white on white to make E squares <u>Sew</u> together to make the block as shown.

#### How to Sew the Runner:

1. Prepare three December blocks as above

2. Cut ten  $2\frac{1}{2}$ "x  $12\frac{1}{2}$ " strips of green for F sashing strips. Join thethree blocks with the F strips, beginning and ending with F; press seams toward F


3. Cut eight 21/2"x 21/2" squares of red for G sashing squares


4. Join four G squares with three F strips to make a border strip twice, sew to make a border to top and bottom of the block strip, press seams toward strips

5. Cut and piece two strips each 3"x 22" and 3"x  $44\frac{1}{2}$ " of Christmas print. Sew the longer strips to opposite long sides and shorter strips to the short ends of the pieced center; press seams toward strips to complete the pieced top.

6. Sandwich batting between the completed top and prepared backing piece; pin and quilt as desired by hand or machine.

### **QUILT GUILD BINGO**

Each player must make at least one fabric game card in order to participate. As with traditional bingo, the more cards you have the more chances you have to win! Bring your bingo cards and buttons for markers to the **Christmas Potluck** on December 12.

**Instructions:** Materials for 1 (10½") card - fabrics must be chosen from one of the following categories: batik, floral, geometric, heart, leaf, metallic, holiday, novelty, paisley, plaid, solid, star, stripe or 1930's print. Use a black print for the centre square.

- 5 (21/2 inch) squares assorted yellow & orange prints
- 5 (2<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> inch) squares assorted red prints
- 5 (2<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> inch) squares assorted blue prints
- 5 (2<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> inch) squares assorted green prints
- 4 (2<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> inch) squares asst. pink & purple prints
- 1 (2 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> inch) square of black print (centre)

Block Assembly: Note: use 1/4 inch seams.

1. Join 5 yellow/orange print squares to make a row. In the same manner, make 1 red, 1 blue, and 1 green row.

2. Join 2 pink/purple squares. Make 2 pink/purple pairs. Join one pink/purple pair to each side of black square to complete pink/purple row. (This is the centre row of your bingo card)

3. Join rows, placing pink/purple row in centre, to complete 1 Bingo Game Card block.

Great prizes!!! At the end of the Bingo Games all the bingo cards will be collected to make comfort quilts. Instructions:Fons & Porters Love of Quilting, September 2006, p.116-117. Permission granted.


