

## **QUILT SHOW PAGE**

### **Quilt Show Categories**

Here are the 2010 Quilt Show Category full descriptions. *Please note: To enter an item in our quilt show, you must have been a paid-up member of Nanaimo Quilters Guild as of September 2009.* 

1. BED QUILT (any size)- Hand or Machine Pieced....HAND QUILTED

2. BED QUILT (any size)- Hand or Machine Pieced...MACHINE QUILTED

3. GROUP QUILT - this means more than one person worked on the quilt (i.e. the quilt was Long Arm or Professionally Quilted by someone other than yourself)

4. LARGE WALL HANGING (over 200 inches in perimeter)

5. SMALL WALL HANGING ( under 200 inches in perimeter)

6. ART QUILTS - no size requirement. This 'mixed media' quilt should extend beyond traditional disciplines, using personal expressions and originality in the design, colour or technique. This must be an original design (not from a commercial pattern).

7.OTHER - clothing, accessories, holiday items, tablerunners, purses, placemats ( items that do not fit into any other category)

8. HAND APPLIQUÉ (any size) - the majority of the quilt top should be hand appliquéd

Thanks again to those who participated in the October and November Block of the Month draws. Both draws were held at the November Meeting since there was so much to do at the Party. Great job, ladies. There were so many blocks for October that we decided to draw two winners. Shirley Fulla won 11 blocks and Monika Kroeger won 10. We were very glad to see that so many of you enjoyed that block. Mickey Lemmon won the 15 November blocks. Congratulations to all and we hope you enjoy using them. Since there seems to be so much interest in the simpler blocks, here is another very popular one. It came to us through Coreen Zerr's sister-in-law, Phyllis Gagner,. She taught it to Coreen's satellite group when she was visiting. This block is a shaded 9-patch with two half-square triangles on opposite corners. This addition really increases the design opportunities. We decided to


use a red centre square to suggest a mock Log Cabin block for cold January days. Remember, accuracy in cutting and

Remember, accuracy in cutting and piecing is important. All seams are  $\frac{1}{2}$ ". Block is 12  $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 12  $\frac{1}{2}$ " (unfinished).

#### Fabric Choices and Cutting:

This Block works very well as a scrappy block so if you like to use up scraps from your stash, here's a great opportunity. For those of you who like a more controlled approach, cut the patches from one or two colours, say brown and green or blue and purple. Whether you go scrappy or controlled, choose four

## January Block of the Month




#### Shaded 9-Patch Block

darks and four lights and one dark red fabric for the centre square. Mottled fabrics or those with small patterns or tone on tone work best for this block.

4 ½" x 4 ½
4 7/8" x 4 7/8"
4 ½" x 4 ½
4 7/8" x 4 7/8"
4 ½" x 4 ½


#### Construction:

First make the two half-square triangles for the opposite corners. Use the two 4 7/8" x 4 7/8" squares (1 dark 1 light) for this. Place the light square *wrong* side up and draw a pencil line from corner to corner. Place this square on the dark square, wrong sides together with light fabric on top. Using the diagonal line as a guide, sew a ¼" seam on either side of the pencil line (*See sketch at top right*)). Cut on the diagonal line and press the seams to the dark.



Now lay out the nine patches on your table, using the sketch of the *block* as a guide. For those of you using the black and white print version, the upper left half of the block is light and the lower right is dark. The red patch is the centre of the block. Sew the block together row by row. Press the centre row in (to the red) and the top and bottom rows out (to the ends). Now nest the seams together and sew the three rows together with the 'red row' in the middle. Press.

### Patty's Custom-Made Pressing Station

Thanks to Patty Jones for sharing her plans for this great pressing station with us. Those of you who went on the sewing room tour last year raved about it.

#### Supply list:

Baltic Birch plywood cut 24 x 60 inches

Padding (thinsulate) cut 28 x 64 inches

Cover fabric cut 36 x 72 inches. Use a canvas or very dense/high thread count drapery lining. DO NOT prewash!

Two plastic drawer-towers (height approx 34in)

#### Upholstery tacks

My pressing station measures 24in x 60in, therefore I can press a full half meter of fabric at a time, with enough room to rest my iron on the end. It was made from Baltic Birch plywood, cut to size by a local building supply store. This is a very dense, stable (14 laminate) product, which resists warping. I attached a quarter round piece of molding to the bottom of the board to keep the top from sliding on the bases (see picture). To do this, I turned the board over - set the bases evenly on the upturned top and then positioned the quarter-round around the outside of this and nailed it in place.

To cover the board I cut the fabric 36in x 72in, 12 inches bigger than the top



measurement. I laid the fabric right side down on a table, making sure I kept the fabric on grain. I then placed the padding, cut 28in x 64in, (4in wider all around than the board) on top. The padding I originally used was an old white wool blanket that had been washed many times so it was, in effect, "felted". A more appropriate padding is thinsulate, or other padding with a reflective surface. Wool, over time, may mildew.

> I placed the board upside down over the padding and fabric and folded both over the edge of the board, keeping everything taut as progressed, and then turned under about 3 in of the fabric so there was a neat folded edge, which gives a more professional finish. I secured the fabric by using upholstery tacks to hold the padding and fabric in place: the plywood has (continued on page 11)

a dense surface, so staples may not be strong enough. You can wrap the padding on the board and attach it prior to tacking the cover fabric, as this helps to keep everything in place.

I turned the covered top right side up and fitted it over the two columns of drawers. I pressed the top with lots of steam so that it shrank to a very tight fit. My station has wheels on it, so I can move it to any position on my carpeted floor. If your floor covering is a solid surface, make sure you use locking wheels to keep the station stable.
